

#### PRE-PROCEDURE INSTRUCTIONS FOR OFFICE PROCEDURES

## Facet Blocks, Medial Branch Blocks, Radiofrequency and SI Joint Injections:

You DO NOT need to stop NSAIDs (Advil, Motrin, Aleve, and Ibuprofen for example), PLAVIX,
 COUMADIN or other blood thinners.

## **Epidural Injections:**

- NSAIDs -STOP 3 prior to procedure
- Prescribed blood thinners

Pradaxa 4 days
Plavix 7 days
Coumadin 5 days
Eliquis 2 days
Xarelto 2 day's cervical and 1 day lumbar
Effient 7 to 10 days
Brilinta 5 to 7 days

Patients on any prescribed blood thinner must contact prescribing physician for clearance and recommendations on when to stop and restart the blood thinner.

• Coumadin is the **ONLY** medication that needs PT/PTT done the morning of the injection.

#### **GUIDELINES for Aspirin Use**

- <u>81 mg Aspirin:</u> Patients **MAY** continue for Lumbar Epidurals. For Cervical Epidurals please dicuss with MD or PA.
- 325 mg Aspirin: Should be changed to 81 mg aspirin 7 days prior to lumbar Epidural.

### **GENERAL**

- Continue all other medications as directed not listed above.
- If you are pregnant or think you may be pregnant, please let us know. The doctor will write an order for a blood test.
- If you are diabetic, please inform the doctor so arrangements can be made regarding your diabetic medication.
- If you are taking oral sedative prior to your procedure, please make arrangements to have someone drive you to and from the procedure.



# **CERVICAL**

- Medial Branch Nerve Block
- Facet Joint Injection
- Radiofrequency Ablation

## Whether you have sedation or not:

- We recommend having a driver for the procedure due to possible temporary post procedure dizzness, which can last up to 12 hours.
- You may use Uber or Lyft for transportation.
- If you do not have a driver you may have to stay in the office after the procedure for monitoring , up to 8 hours.
- We do **NOT** recommend returning to work the **day** of the procedure.
